**SUBJECT: PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE TACOMA AIA 2009**

Dear Director Rathburn:

The Tacoma Police Department has an ongoing review process of the Tacoma Alcohol Impact areas. During this review, we made observations of Chronic Public Inebriant activity and abandoned alcohol container accumulation. Due to these observations and consultations the Tacoma Police Department has had with numerous community groups and alcohol distributors, we are requesting the following changes to Tacoma's current AIA lists. The goal is to have a standardized list for both of Tacoma's AIA's which is easier to follow for all parties involved. It will also better reflect the current situation involving products and trends in consumption of these products in Tacoma. To that end the City is proposing that some products be added to the restricted list and some products that are no longer available be removed.

WAC 314-12-215 authorizes the Board to restrict products within an AIA. There are two categories of products that the City is requesting that the Board restrict. First, the City is requesting that products that are prohibited in one AIA be prohibited in the other. All of these products have been linked to problems associated with Chronic Public Inebriation and it undermines the effectiveness of both AIA's if a product that has been demonstrated to be a problem in one AIA is permitted to be sold in the other AIA. Additionally, a uniform list will make it easier for distributors to comply with the AIA restrictions.

The other category of products is "new" products that are not currently on the restricted list for either AIA. These products are similar in material respects to those already prohibited. These products may not be different from restricted products except for labeling or other minor differences. The introduction of similar products undermines the effectiveness of an AIA and may facilitate chronic public inebriation and the illegal activity associated with off-premises alcohol sales and/or consumption.

The restriction of all these products is reasonably related to reducing chronic public inebriation or illegal activity associated with off-premises alcohol sales and/or consumption.

## **Purposed changes to the Tacoma AIA 2009**

The Tacoma Police Department has an ongoing review process of the Tacoma Alcohol Impact areas. During this review, we made observations of Chronic Public Inebriant activity and abandoned alcohol container accumulation. Due to these observations and consultations the Tacoma Police Department has had with numerous community groups and alcohol distributors, we are requesting the following changes to Tacoma's current AIA lists. It will also better reflect the current situation involving products and trends in consumption of these products in Tacoma. To that end the City is proposing that some products be added to the restricted list and some products that are no longer available be removed.

WAC 314-12-215 authorizes the Board to restrict products within an AIA. There are two categories of products that the City is requesting that the Board restrict. First, the City is requesting that products that are prohibited in one AIA be prohibited in the other. All of these products have been linked to problems associated with Chronic Public Inebriation and it undermines the effectiveness of both AIA's if a product that has been demonstrated to be a problem in one AIA is permitted to be sold in the other AIA. Additionally, a uniform list will make it easier for distributors to comply with the AIA restrictions.

The other category of products is "new" products that are not currently on the restricted list for either AIA. These products are similar in material respects to those already prohibited. These products may not be different from restricted products except for labeling or other minor differences. The introduction of similar products undermines the effectiveness of an AIA and may facilitate chronic public inebriation and the illegal activity associated with off-premises alcohol sales and/or consumption.

The restriction of all these products is reasonably related to reducing chronic public inebriation or illegal activity associated with off-premises alcohol sales and/or consumption.

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I certify (or declare) that the following is true and correct under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of Washington:

1. I am a commissioned police officer with the Tacoma Police Department. I have been employed by the Tacoma Police Department for 10 years. I am over the age of 18 and competent to testify herein.

2. The City of Tacoma is divided into four police sectors. I am currently assigned as a Community Liaison Officer for Sector Four. Most of the Lincoln District AIA is contained within Sector Four. I have been a Community Liaison Officer for 4 years. One of my duties as a Community Liaison Officer has been to assist the community effort to establish an AIA in the Lincoln District.

3. As a Community Liaison Officer I respond to citizen concerns within my sector.

1           4.       Since the implementation of Tacoma's second AIA we have seen a reduction in the  
2 calls for service related to alcohol. (see attached information)  
3

4           5.       We have also seen a reduction in the street dwelling CPI's that routinely created  
5 most of the alcohol related calls for service.  
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7           6.       Though there has been a marked improvement in the above listed factors, several  
8 new issues have come to light. These issues are as follows: CPI's have switched their product of  
9 choice and are now consuming beverages that have been brought in to replace items that are on the  
10 banned list, this is confirmed by observations from myself and concerned community members.  
11 These products follow the traditional pattern of high alcohol content at a low price. (See the  
12 attached list for details)  
13

14 The community members from the various neighborhood groups have found it difficult to monitor  
15 the AIA due to the two separate lists of banned product. I have routinely received erroneous  
16 information about banned product being consumed in the second AIA. Upon investigation, I  
17 discovered the community group was mistaken and the products were not on the second AIA list. I  
18 have spoken to several CPI's that were equally confused about what product could be purchased and  
19 where.  
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21 We have also found on the banned lists products that are no longer sold in either AIA area.  
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23           7.       The most reasonable correction to these problems would be a standardizing of both  
24 Tacoma AIA product lists and the addition of the current problem products to both lists. The lists  
25 could then be purged of product from both lists that are no longer sold. This will provide the  
26 community with a standardized list that is accurate and up to date serving the citizens of the City of  
27 Tacoma.

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2. The City of Tacoma is divided into four police sectors. I am currently assigned as a Community Liaison Officer for Sector Four. Most of the Lincoln District AIA is contained within Sector Four. I have been a Community Liaison Officer for 4 years. One of my duties as a Community Liaison Officer has been to assist the community effort to establish an AIA in the Lincoln District.

3. As a Community Liaison Officer I respond to citizen concerns within my sector.

1           4.       Since the implementation of Tacoma's second AIA (the Lincoln AIA) we have seen  
2 a reduction in alcohol-related calls for service. Information from the Tacoma Police Department is  
3 attached as Exhibit 1.

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5           5.       I have observed a reduction in street dwelling Chronic Public Inebriates (CPI's)  
6 that routinely created most of the alcohol related calls for service.

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8           6.       Despite these improvements, CPI's have switched their product of choice and are  
9 now consuming alcoholic beverages that are similar to those on the restricted products list (i.e. high  
10 alcohol content at a low price). This is confirmed by observations from myself and concerned  
11 community members. I am concerned that the availability of these replacement products will  
12 reverse the initial gains made through the implementation of the Lincoln AIA, and that problems  
13 associated with CPI's will again increase. The characteristics of these products and the increase in  
14 their use by CPI's, indicates that they are reasonably linked to problems associated with chronic  
15 public inebriation. A list of these products is attached as Exhibit 2.

16  
17           7.       The community members from the various neighborhood groups have found it  
18 difficult to monitor the Lincoln AIA due to the existence of two separate lists of restricted products,  
19 one for the Lincoln AIA and one for the Downtown Core AIA. I have routinely received erroneous  
20 information about banned product being consumed in the Lincoln AIA. Upon investigation, I  
21 discovered the community group was mistaken and the products were not on the Lincoln AIA list,  
22 but were on the Downtown Core AIA list. I have spoken to several CPI's that were equally  
23 confused about what product could be purchased and where.



25           8.       We have also found on the banned lists products that are no longer sold in either  
26 AIA area. A list of these products is attached as Exhibit 3.

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28           9.       Standardizing the restricted product lists for both Tacoma AIA's would alleviate  
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this confusion and would ensure that problem products were not readily available to CPI's. Adding the new problem products to both lists would ensure that the gains made by the existence of the AIA's is not lost. The lists could then be purged of products from both lists that are no longer sold. This will provide the community with a standardized list that is accurate and up to date serving the citizens of the City of Tacoma.









per sq kilometer**


**Change in Alcohol Related 2004-2006**

- All three calls types decreased in Area 2 while only Minor in Possession decreased in Area 1. There was a 29.3% increase in Drunk in Public calls.



# Alcohol Impact Areas (AIA)


1 August 2007 to 30 April 2008



# Alcohol Impact Areas (AIA)


1 August 2008 to 30 April 2009

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




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
