



Bill Title: Craft Distilleries License

Bill Number: SHB 2959 Effective Date: June 12, 2008

Amends: RCW 66.24.140, New Section added to RCW 66.24

Background:

This bill creates a craft distillery license with the following requirements and privileges:

- Annual license fee is \$100 (compared to \$2000 for a distillery license)
- Produce 20,000 gallons or less of spirits
- At least half of the raw materials used in production must be grown in Washington
- Sell spirits of its own production for off-premises consumption limit two liters per day per person
- Samples maximum of two ounces per person per day free of charge at the distillery
- Spirits used for samples and off-premises sales must be purchased from the Liquor Control Board
- Requires Mandatory Alcohol Server Training and MAST permit for any person who is involved in the service of samples

Implementation:

To apply for a Craft Distillery liquor license:

Complete a Master Business License application and Liquor Control Board Addendum. Information and applications are available on the WSLCB Web site (www.liq.wa.gov):

- Licenses and Permits
- Licenses and Permits Forms Page
- IN-STATE ONLY
- Master Application Packet Page Non Retail
- Master Application Packet for NON RETAIL License start with number 1, Master Application

When License Division receives the application:

- A liquor license investigator will be assigned to the application
- The investigator will contact the applicant to conduct an interview and send the applicant a request for documents needed to process the application (the applicant has 15 days to return documents)
- A notice will be sent to the local authority for comment (20 day period)
- A public posting notice will be sent to the local liquor enforcement office to be posted at the craft distillery premises (must be posted for 14 days)
- When all documents are received and the investigation is complete the applicant will receive a letter from License division with either a conditional approval or approval of the liquor license
- When the license is approved the licensee should receive a Master License from Master License Service within 14 days.
