



## Retail Liquor License Description and Fee Information Sheet

Use this sheet to fill out the Licenses and Fees section (section 2) of the Master Application.

**Note:** If you withdraw your application or if your application is not approved for any reason, \$75 is kept as a processing fee (per RCW 66.24.015).

### Liquor License Change of Location

To close your present business and move to a new location..... \$75

### Beer and Wine Gift Delivery

To deliver beer and/or wine in bottles or original packages in conjunction with gifts or flowers. Beer and Wine Gift Delivery licensees may hold no other class of liquor license..... \$75

### Beer and Wine Specialty Shop

To sell beer and/or wine\* for off-premises consumption in bottles, cans, or original containers. Must maintain a \$3,000 minimum wholesale inventory of beer and/or wine..... \$100

**Note:** The Board may designate as “restricted,” based on recommendations by the local government authority. A restricted designation prohibits the sale of wine with an alcohol content of 14 percent or more by volume, or strong beer.

### Grocery Store

To sell beer and/or wine\* for off-premises consumption in bottles, cans, or original containers. Must maintain a \$3,000 minimum inventory of food products for human consumption, not to include soda pop, beer, or wine..... \$150

**Note:** The Board may designate as “restricted,” based on recommendations by the local government authority. A restricted designation prohibits the sale of wine with an alcohol content of 14 percent or more by volume, or strong beer.

International Exporter Endorsement - Allows the sale of beer and wine to locations outside the United States..... \$500

### Motel

A retail license issued to Hotels/Motels allowing the sale of spirits, beer, wine by the bottle from honor bars within guest rooms. Allows the service of beer and wine without charge to overnight guests for on-premises consumption..... \$500

### Private Club - Beer and Wine

To sell beer and/or wine for on-premises consumption. Beer and wine may be sold either on tap or in opened bottles or cans. Private Club licensees may **not** sell beer or wine for off-premises consumption..... \$180

### Nonprofit Arts Organization

Allows a nonprofit arts organization which sponsors and presents artistic or cultural performances to sell spirits, beer, and wine to patrons for consumption on the premises ..... \$250

### Private Club - Spirits, Beer, and Wine

To sell spirits, beer, and wine by the individual serving for on-premises consumption. Beer and wine may be sold either on tap or in opened bottles or cans. Private Club licensees may **not** sell beer or wine for off-premises consumption..... \$720

Non-Club Event Endorsement - Allows up to 40 non-club, member-sponsored events annually using club liquor..... \$900

### Public House

A retail license that allows the manufacture of no less than 250 gallons and no more than 2,400 barrels of beer on the licensed premises, and the sale of beer and wine at retail for on-premises consumption..... \$1,000

Holders of a Public House license may **not** sell beer or wine to go. Public House licensees may apply for a Spirits, Beer, and Wine Restaurant license, in order to sell spirits by the individual glass for consumption on the premises.

### Restaurant - Beer and/or Wine

To sell beer and/or wine for on-premises consumption in conjunction with food sales, either on tap or in opened bottles or cans.

Beer..... \$200

Wine..... \$200

To sell beer and/or wine for off-premises consumption in original, unopened containers. Tap beer may also be sold for off-premises consumption in kegs not less than four gallons and in other sanitary containers..... \$120

Caterer's Endorsement - Extends the on-premises license privilege to allow the sale and service of beer and wine at approved locations other than the licensed premises..... \$350

### Restaurant - Spirits, Beer, and Wine

To sell spirits, beer, and wine by the individual serving for on-premises consumption. Beer and wine may be sold either on tap or in opened bottles or cans. Issued only to restaurants that meet specific food service, kitchen equipment, and floor space requirements. Spirits, Beer, and Wine Restaurants are **not** eligible to sell spirits, beer, or wine to go.

Less than 50% dedicated dining area..... \$2,000

50% or more dedicated dining area..... \$1,600

Service bar only (no entertainment allowed)..... \$1,000

**Note:** Fee may be prorated for seasonal operations in unincorporated areas.

Caterer's Endorsement - Extends the on-premises license privilege to allow the sale and service of liquor at approved locations other than the licensed premises..... \$350

Off-Premises Sale Private Label Wine - Allows the holder of a spirits, beer & wine restaurant, spirits, beer and wine club, beer and wine club or sports/entertainment license to sell privately labeled wine by the unopened bottle for off-premises consumption. \$120

### Duplicate License - Spirits, Beer, and Wine Restaurant

To allow a Spirits, Beer, and Wine Restaurant to sell liquor from additional sites. These sites must be located on the same property and owned by the same licensee.

Fee is **per** duplicate license:

Airport terminal.....	25% of annual license fee
Civic center.....	\$10
Privately owned facility open to the public.....	\$20

### Snack Bar

To sell beer for on-premises consumption by open bottle or can only. Snack bar licensees are **not** eligible to sell beer to go.....

\$125

### Sports/Entertainment Facility

To sell spirits, beer, and wine by the individual glass for on-premises consumption at Board approved locations. Issued only to establishments that offer sporting events for an admission charge.....

\$2,500

Caterer's Endorsement - Extends the on-premises license privilege to allow the sale and service of liquor at approved locations other than the licensed premises.....

\$350

### Tavern - No Persons Under 21 Allowed

To sell beer and/or wine for on-premises consumption, either on tap or in opened bottles or cans. Person under 21 years of age are not allowed on the premises.

Beer.....	\$200
Wine.....	\$200

To sell beer and/or wine for off-premises consumption in original unopened containers. Tap beer may also be sold for off-premises consumption in kegs not less than four gallons and in other sanitary containers.....

\$120

### Retailer Receiving Direct Shipments from Out-of-State

Allows a licensed Washington retailer to receive shipments of beer and wine from a U.S. winery or brewery holding a certificate of approval to ship into Washington, and a domestic winery, brewery or micro brewery.
