



STIPULATED SETTLEMENT
AGREEMENT

The Washington State Liquor Control Board Education and Enforcement Division ("Enforcement") represented by its attorneys, ROBERT M. MCKENNA Attorney General and GORDON P. KARG, Assistant Attorney General and the Licensee, ERNIE'S FUEL STOPS ("Licensee") represented by JOHN SUGG, Controller, hereby enter into this stipulated settlement agreement for Liquor Control Board ("LCB") Case Number 22,780.

I. INTRODUCTION

The Washington State Liquor Control Board charged the above-named Licensee in its Administrative Violation Notice ("AVN") No. 2P7233B, dated August 23, 2007, with the following violation of the Washington State Liquor Act:

That on or about August 21, 2007 the above-named Licensee or employee(s) thereof, supplied liquor to a person under 21 years of age, for off premises consumption, contrary to RCW 66.44.270.

Prior to the filling of an administrative complaint in this matter, Enforcement and the Licensee wish to enter into a settlement agreement concerning the above-referenced AVN.

1 **II. AGREEMENT OF THE PARTIES**

2 Enforcement and the Licensee agree to the following:

3 1. Enforcement and the Licensee enter into this agreement to avoid the time and
4 expense of further litigation. The Licensee explicitly waives the right of further administrative
5 review of all matters related to this violation. The Licensee hereby voluntarily withdraws its
6 request for a hearing on the matter.

7 2. The Licensee admits to the violation set forth in the above-referenced AVN. On
8 August 21, 2007, the Licensee and/or employee(s) thereof supplied liquor to a person under 21
9 years of age, for off premises consumption.

10 3. The parties agree that as a third violation for supplying liquor to a person under
11 21 years of age, for off premises consumption, the standard penalty is a 30-day suspension of
12 the Licensee's liquor license pursuant to WAC 314-29-020.

13 4. The parties agree that the standard penalty shall be reduced and instead a 21-day
14 suspension of the Licensee's liquor license shall be imposed effective upon the dates indicated
15 by the Washington State Liquor Control Board in its final order in LCB Case No. 22,780,
16 approving this stipulated settlement agreement.

17 5. The Licensee agrees to implement or continue to implement the following
18 policies, effective upon issuance of a final order by the Washington State Liquor Control
19 Board approving this stipulated settlement agreement:

- 20 a) mandatory identification check for all alcohol purchases;
21 b) required use of cash register age-identification computer program which
22 automatically informs employees of a patron's age for all alcohol sales;
23 c) mandatory alcohol/tobacco policy and procedure training for all new
24 employees; and
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d) all store managers will conduct quarterly meetings in which all alcohol/tobacco policies, procedures and acceptable forms of identification will be fully reviewed with all employees.


6. The parties recognize that this settlement agreement is subject to approval by the Washington State Liquor Control Board.
