STIPULATED SETTLEMENT
AGREEMENT

The Washington State Liquor Control Board Education and Enforcement Division (Enforcement) by and through its attorneys, ROBERT M. MCKENNA, Attorney General and STEPHANIE U. HAPPOLD, Assistant Attorney General, and TY-CO PETROLEUM GROUP, LLC d/b/a GATEWAY GAS & DELI (Licensee) of Snoqualmie, Washington, through its attorney, CASSANDRA STAMM, and its representative, MARK MCDONALD, hereby enter into this stipulated settlement agreement (Agreement) for Liquor Control Board Case Nos. 23,777 & 23,778.

I. INTRODUCTION

1. On March 9, 2011, the Washington State Liquor Control Board issued a complaint, based upon Administrative Violation Notice (AVN) No. 2M0209E, charging the Licensee with the following alleged violation of the Washington State Liquor Act:

1 That on or about July 28, 2010, the above-named Licensee, or an employee thereof,
2 gave, sold and/or supplied liquor to a person under the age of twenty-one (21), contrary to
3 RCW 66.44.270 and WAC 314-11-020(1).

4 2. On March 9, 2011 the Washington State Liquor Control Board issued a
5 complaint, based upon Administrative Violation Notice (AVN) No. 2M0244A, charging the
6 Licensee with the following alleged violation of the Washington State Liquor Act:

7 That on or about September 1, 2010, the above-named Licensee, or an employee
8 thereof, gave, sold and/or supplied liquor to a person under the age of twenty-one (21),
9 contrary to RCW 66.44.270 and WAC 314-11-020(1).

10 3. Enforcement and the Licensee wish to enter into an Agreement concerning the
11 above-referenced Complaints.

12 II. AGREEMENT OF THE PARTIES

13 Enforcement and the Licensee agree to the following:

14 1. The parties enter into this Agreement to avoid the time and expense of further
15 litigation.

16 2. The Licensee explicitly waives the right of further administrative review of all
17 matters related to the above-referenced violations. Furthermore, the Licensee hereby
18 voluntarily withdraws its request for a hearing in these matters.

19 3. This Agreement constitutes the final written expression of all the terms of this
20 agreement and is a complete and exclusive statement of these terms, and shall be effective
21 when signed by all parties and/or their legal representatives.

22 4. The Licensee admits to the violation that on July 28, 2010, the above-named
23 Licensee, or an employee thereof, gave, sold and/or supplied liquor to a person under the age
24 of twenty-one (21), contrary to RCW 66.44.270 and WAC 314-11-020(1). The parties agree
25 that this violation would be the second violation pursuant to WAC 314-29-020 within a twenty-
26

1 four (24) month period, which carries a standard penalty of a seven (7) days suspension of the
2 liquor license.

3 5. The Licensee admits to the violation that on September 1, 2010, the above-
4 named Licensee, or an employee thereof, gave, sold and/or supplied liquor to a person under
5 the age of twenty-one (21), contrary to RCW 66.44.270 and WAC 314-11-020(1). The parties
6 agree that this violation would be the third violation pursuant to WAC 314-29-020 within a
7 twenty-four (24) month period, which carries a standard penalty of a thirty (30) days suspension
8 of the liquor license.

9 6. The Licensee acknowledges it has terminated its business operations involving
10 the above-mentioned liquor license, voluntarily relinquished the liquor license, and no longer
11 has an interest in the license at issue.

12 7. The parties agree that the Licensee's cessation of business operations involving
13 the liquor license and the voluntarily relinquishing of the liquor license has effectively mooted
14 Enforcement's actions and shall act in lieu of the standard penalty.

15 8. The Licensee agrees that if it has failed to relinquish its liquor license, for any
16 reason, the standard combined penalties for the two violations of a thirty-seven (37) day
17 suspension shall be imposed.


18 9. The parties recognize that this settlement agreement is subject to approval by


