
1 January 3, 2012¹ is sustained and the Licensee shall pay a total monetary penalty of three
2 hundred dollars (\$300) for the above-referenced violation, and the Licensee shall comply with
3 other terms of the settlement agreement such as ensuring all employees complete training and
4 assisting law enforcement to reduce crime on the premises. The Licensee shall pay the
5 monetary penalty within thirty (30) days of the date of the Final Order of the Board. All

The Washington State Liquor Control Board Education and Enforcement Division (Enforcement) represented by its attorneys, ROBERT M. MCKENNA, Attorney General, and TIMOTHY D. FORD, Assistant Attorney General, and the Licensee, K PARMAR ENTERPRISES, INC. d/b/a 7-ELEVEN 2306-23140C, through its representative, KULDEEP PARMAR, hereby enter into this stipulated settlement agreement for Liquor Control Board Case Number 23,898.

I. INTRODUCTION

The Washington State Liquor Control Board, Enforcement and Education Division charged the above-named Licensee in a Complaint dated January 3, 2012¹, with the following alleged violation of the Washington State Liquor Control Board rules and regulations:

1 On or about August 17, 2011 the above-named Licensee, or employee(s) thereof, sold,
2 allowed, and/or permitted an apparently intoxicated person(s) to consume liquor and/or possess
3 liquor on the licensed premises, contrary to RCW 66.44.200(1) and/or WAC 314-16-150.

4 Enforcement and the Licensee wish to enter into a settlement agreement concerning the
5 above-referenced Complaint.

6 II. AGREEMENT OF THE PARTIES

7 Enforcement and the Licensee agree to the following:

8 1. Enforcement and the Licensee enter into this agreement to avoid the time and
9 expense of further litigation. The Licensee explicitly waives the right of further administrative
10 review of all matters related to the above-referenced violation. The Licensee hereby
11 voluntarily withdraws its requests for a hearing in this matter.

12 2. This agreement constitutes the final written expression of all the terms of this
13 agreement and is a complete and exclusive statement of these terms.

14 3. The Licensee stipulates to the violation set forth above and referenced in the
15 Complaint: On or about August 17, 2011 the above-named Licensee, or employee(s) thereof,
16 sold, allowed, and/or permitted an apparently intoxicated person(s) to consume liquor and/or
17 possess liquor on the licensed premises, contrary to RCW 66.44.200(1) and/or WAC 314-16-
18 150.

19 4. The Licensee acknowledges this is the Licensee's first violation of this type
20 within a twenty-four (24) month period, which carries a standard penalty of a five (5) day
21 suspension of the liquor license or a five hundred dollar (\$500) monetary fine pursuant to
22 WAC 314-29-020.

23 5. The Licensee agrees to pay a three hundred dollar (\$300) monetary fine for the
24 above-referenced violation.

25 6. The Licensee agrees to assist law enforcement, where practical, with monitoring
26 the area of the licensed premises and its parking lot to reduce reports of "shoulder tapping" by

1 persons under the age of twenty-one years (21) attempting to solicit adults to purchase alcohol
2 on their behalf, and to reduce any other reports of criminal activities in the area.

3 7. The Licensee agrees to have all employees' complete training on the sale of
4 liquor, to be provided at no cost by the Liquor Control Board within thirty (30) days after entry
5 of the Final Order of the Board. The Licensee agrees to have all future employees complete
6 training on the sale of liquor, to be provided at no cost by the Liquor Control Board within
7 thirty (30) days of each employee's initial hire date.


8 8. In the event that the Licensee does not fully and timely satisfy the penalties and
9 conditions set forth in Section II, Paragraph 5, 6 and 7, then the standard penalty shall be
10 imposed as referenced under Section II, Paragraph 4.

11 9. The undersigned parties declare that the terms of this Settlement Agreement are
12 completely read, wholly understood, and voluntarily accepted for the purpose of making a full
13 and final compromise and settlement of any and all claims arising from the above referenced
14 Complaint.

15 10. The parties recognize that this settlement agreement is subject to approval by
16 the Washington State Liquor Control Board.




