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AN AMENDMENT TO THE AUGUST 30, 2006 RESOLUTION OF THE WASHINGTON STATE LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD RECOGNIZING THE CITY OF SEATTLE'S ALCOHOL IMPACT AREAS, REQUEST TO ADD HIGH-ALCOHOL CONTENT, LOW-COST BEVERAGES TO THE BANNED PRODUCT LIST

Whereas, the Board recognizes its statutory mandate to protect the public's welfare, health, peace, and safety and its responsibility to work with communities to help mitigate negative impacts of chronic public inebriation associated with the sale of alcohol by the businesses it regulates.

Whereas, in recognition of this mandate, in 1999, the Liquor Control Board adopted the Alcohol Impact Area rules, Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 314-12-210 through WAC 314-12-225. These rules establish a framework for the Liquor Control Board, working in partnership with local government and community organizations, to mitigate negative impacts that result from the presence of chronic public inebriation. Preventing and reducing the harm caused by alcohol consumption requires a comprehensive, multi-dimensional response by neighborhood residents, businesses, and government agencies, including coordinated treatment services, health care, housing services and vocational training. Mandatory restrictions on alcohol sales imposed by the Board are a key element in the effort to mitigate the negative impacts of chronic public inebriation.

Whereas, the Board adopted a resolution recognizing Seattle's Central Core and North Alcohol Impact Areas on August 30, 2006 and that said resolution remains in effect.

Whereas, the city of Seattle's June 26, 2008 request to amend the Banned Products List adopted by the on Board January 14, 2009 meets the requirements for Board recognition in WAC 314-12-215(4) by including findings of fact pertaining to the presence of chronic public inebriation.

Whereas, the city of Seattle requests that the Liquor Control Board impose mandatory restrictions on the off-premises sale of alcohol by licensees in the Central Core and North Alcohol Impact Areas. Specifically, the city requests the following restriction:

- 1) No sales of certain low-cost, high alcohol content beer and wine products identified by a banned products list.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,

The Board resolves to impose the following mandatory restrictions requested by the city of Seattle, to take effect **March 1, 2009**. The March 1, 2009 effective date applies only to the nine added products. All other elements of the August 30, 2008 Board resolution remains unchanged:

No sales of the beer and wine products listed on the following page. All flavors, alcohol content, and container sizes of the following named products are hereby banned from off-premises sale by licensees in the alcohol impact area.
