



Bill Title: Medical Marijuana--Administration to Students

Bill Number: SHB 1095

Effective Date: July 28, 2019

Amends: RCW 69.51A.060

Summary

This bill:

- Requires school districts to allow students to consume marijuana-infused products for medical purposes on school grounds, on a school bus, or while attending a school-sponsored event
- Requires that school districts must establish policies related to the consumption of marijuana-infused products by students for medical purposes
- Uses the definition of “marijuana-infused products” from RCW 69.50.101(ee) to mean products that contain marijuana or marijuana extracts, are intended for human use, are derived from marijuana, and have a THC concentration no greater than ten percent. The term does not include either usable marijuana or marijuana concentrates
- Prohibits the administration of medical marijuana by smoking or inhalation while the student is on school grounds, on a school bus, or while attending a school-sponsored event

Provisions of the bill will be suspended if the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) receives communication from the federal government that federal education funding will be withheld if the state continues to implement measures under the bill.
