Meeting Minutes

1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Jane Rushford called the regular meeting of the Washington State Liquor and Cannabis Board to order at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, November 28, 2018. Member Ollie Garrett and Member Russ Hauge were also present.

3. EMPLOYEE ANNOUNCEMENTS

Public Service Recognition - Presenter: Justin Nordhorn, Chief of Enforcement and Education

Chair Rushford and Chief Nordhorn acknowledged Officer Henry Gill for his act of heroism in assisting a state trooper that was being assaulted. Chief Nordhorn stated that Officer Gill had been given both the Washington State Patrol Award of Merit and the National Liquor Law Enforcement Association Agent of the Year.

4. ACTION ITEMS (A-B)

ACTION ITEM 4A - Board Approval of CR 101 for Marijuana Signage

Kathy Hoffman, Policy and Rules Coordinator, began the briefing with materials (HANDOUTS 4A 1-2).

Ms. Hoffman: Rulemaking is needed because packaging and labeling rules were recently amended and will be effective January 1, 2019. Among the amendments was removal of specific label warnings concerning the use of marijuana during pregnancy and these warnings also appear in the mandatory signage rules under WAC 314-55-086. Modifying mandatory marijuana signage will assure a consistent coordinated consumer messaging regarding the use of marijuana during pregnancy.

ACTION ITEM 4B - Board Approval of CR 102 for Vapor Product Rules

Karen McCall, Policy and Rules Coordinator, began the briefing with materials (HANDOUTS 4B 1-3).

Ms. McCall: This comes about from legislation passed in 2016. After that legislation we did adopt a few rules. Over the last year our enforcement officers have visited over 1,400 licensed and unlicensed vapor product locations. Based on what they found in those visits it was felt we needed to further clarify these rules.

Ms. McCall highlighted a few items included in the rulemaking package:

New Section. WAC 314-23-015 Definitions. Added definitions for "domicile" and "manufacture".

Amended Section. WAC 314-35-020 Vapor product licenses required – Licensing requirements, denials, suspensions, and revocations. Added licensing requirements and qualifications for vapor products.

New Section. WAC 314-35-027 What persons or entities have to qualify for a vapor products license? Added language regarding true parties of interest.

Amended Section. WAC 314-35-040 Age-restricted vapor products retailer licensed locations. Included language that vapor products licensed locations that allow vapor product sampling must be restricted to persons age 18 or older at all times.

<u>Jim Sultan – A Bud and Leaf Inc.</u>

We have sent a letter to each of you this morning regarding our request for a consideration of a rule change with regard to the 1,000 foot requirement with reverence to the location of an I-502 store. We did this because we're trying to move our store and admittedly it may not be necessary if we can get an extension of time with respect to our efforts to move the store.

We have been at this for a while, working incessantly and continuously since we were actually evicted from our property because the building was torn down. Finding another location has been a bit of a challenge. We do have one, we are ready to move, we just need a little bit more time and I wanted to inform you of that. You will find that letter in your email when open it next.

Chair Rushford: Thank you very much for being here today, Jim. There are some statutory requirements affiliated with this but we will take a closer look at what you provided today. I'm not sure if there are local ordinances involved. Thank you.

Mr. Sultan: We think there is a conflict between the local ordinance and the Board rules so we'd like you to take a look at that.

Chair Rushford: Again, I think that some of this is statutory in nature but we will break it down and see what, if anything, is possible.

Mr. Sultan: Thank you very much for your time and consideration.
