

Transaction and Possession Limits for Low-THC Beverages

Cannabis Retailers



New legislation, <u>SHB 1249</u> changed the limits for buying cannabis by creating a new product type: low THC-infused beverages; this guide covers transaction limits for this product type.

Useful terms:

Low THC-infused beverages: beverages containing no more than 4 milligrams of THC per unit.

Transaction limit: The amount of cannabis product a consumer can legally buy from a licensed cannabis retailer.

New legislation effective June 6, 2024

For low-THC beverages only: A customer can buy up to 200mg of THC in a day. For example, under the new limits, a customer can buy up to 50, 4 mg THC cans at a time.

Example of low-THC infused beverage.

<u>RCW 69.50.360</u> sets the current limits for four categories of product. A customer may buy up to one ounce of usable cannabis,16 ounces of edibles in solid form, 72 fluid ounces of cannabis-infused product in liquid form, and seven grams of cannabis concentrates.

A related law:

<u>RCW 69.50.4013</u> governs how much cannabis one person can legally provide to another person of legal age. These limits use the same categories as the buying limits but are set at half of the amount.
