

Notice of Emergency Rule WSR #19-21-101

The Washington State Liquor and Cannabis Board (Board) has filed an emergency rule consistent with the directives of Executive Order 19-03, dated September 27, 2019, requiring marijuana licensees to post warning signs regarding the health risks of vapor products where vapor products containing THC are sold, in addition to the existing requirements described in WAC 314-55-086.

Consistent with RCW 34.05.350, any agency may find that the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.

An emergency rule adopted under RCW 34.05.350 takes effect upon filing with the code reviser, unless a later date is specified in the order of adoption, and may not remain in effect for longer than one hundred twenty days after filing.

Consistent with RCW 34.05.350(3), within seven days after the rule is adopted, any person may petition the governor requesting the immediate repeal of a rule adopted on an emergency basis by any department listed in RCW <u>43.17.010</u>. Within seven days after submission of the petition, the governor shall either deny the petition in writing, stating his or her reasons for the denial, or order the immediate repeal of the rule.
