Overall meeting goal: To engage with our industry partners and other interested partners to review conceptual draft rules.



Why are we here?


- The WSLCB is revising cannabis quality control testing rules in order to align more closely with the Department of Health's Marijuana Product Compliance rules in chapter 246-70 WAC.
- The WSLCB is currently in the inquiry phase of the rulemaking process.
 - A <u>Preproposal Statement of Inquiry (CR-101)</u> was filed on August 8, 2018.
 - A <u>Proposed Rule Making (CR-102)</u> was filed on January 22, 2020.
 - A <u>Proposed Rule Making (CR-102)</u> was filed on March 11, 2020 in response to COVID-19 limitations.
 - A <u>Proposed Rule Making (CR-102)</u> was filed on May 27, 2020 in response to COVID-19 limitations.
 - A <u>Supplemental Proposed Rule Making (CR-102)</u> was filed on September 30, 2020.
- Your feedback during today's forum will help inform and shape the rules.






How will data be collected, shared, and presented to decision makers?

Basic Rule Making Process


The standard rule making process is described in chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative Procedures Act, and divided into three stages:

- Stage 1: Pre-proposal Statement of Inquiry (CR-101) RCW 34.05.310
- Stage 2: Proposed Rule Making (CR-102) RCW 34.05.320
- State 3: Rule-making Order (CR-103) RCW 34.05.360

Each stage consists of specific tasks and processes.
