

Cannabis Plant Canopy World Café Session 1

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Overall meeting goal: To engage with our industry and other interested partners to explore themes related to cannabis plant canopy.

Today's meeting intentions:

Why are we here?

- Rules that outline privileges, requirements, and fees for cannabis producer licensees, including guidelines
 for the maximum area that a producer licensee may dedicate to cannabis production were created to
 implement Initiative 502.
- The area of the producer licensee's premises dedicated to live plant production is called plant canopy and is defined in WAC 314-55- 010(31), and described in part as the area dedicated to live plant production, including maintaining mother plants, propagating plants from seed to plant tissue, clones, and vegetative and flowering areas.
- Cannabis producers use a wide range of techniques and configuration in plant cultivation.



What is World Café?

A participatory workshop method, suitable for groups from 12 to 2,000 participants. It is a structured conversational process intended to facilitate open conversation and discussion. It links ideas among a group to access the "collective intelligence" of participants, and to understand/learn from multiple points of view.

The focus is on exploring/innovating on themes rather than on problem solving. The format is designed as a forum for creative/open thinking, and is not suited for scenarios where there is a predetermined answer or solution.

During this event, hosts and participants will:

- Focus on what matters;
- Contribute your thinking;
- Speak your mind and heart;
- Listen to understand;
- Link and connect ideas; and
- Listen together for insights and deeper questions.

Subject of possible rule making: The Washington State Liquor and Cannabis Board (WSLCB) is considering creating new rules regarding plant canopy, and amending or repealing rules regarding plant canopy including WAC 314-55-075 and WAC 314-55-010(31).

Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject: RCW 69.50.342 and 69.50.345

Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish: Cannabis producers utilize a wide range of techniques and configurations in plant cultivation.

Rulemaking may be necessary to create, amend or repeal the rules on plant canopy after review.
